1 **SECTION 1. RESTORATION OF EFFECTIVENESS OF TERMI-**
2 **NATED PROVISIONS OF AGRICULTURAL AD-**
3 **JUSTMENT ACT REGULATING FEDERAL MILK**
4 **MARKETING ORDERS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Effective as of December 31,
6 1996, section 101(b) of the Agriculture and Food Act of
7 1981 (Public Law 97–98; 95 Stat. 1219; 7 U.S.C. 608c
8 note) is amended by striking “1996” and inserting
9 “1999”.

10 (b) TREATMENT OF PERIOD OF LAPSED EFFECTIVE-
11 NESS.—The amendments made by section 101(a) of the
12 Agriculture and Food Act of 1981 (Public Law 97–98;
13 95 Stat. 1219) shall continue in force as if never termi-
14 nated as a result of the expiration of the period of effec-
15 tiveness of the amendments on December 31, 1996.
