Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of nine measures relating to the policy of the United States with respect to the People's Republic of China.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 2358) to provide for improved monitoring of human rights
4 violations in the People's Republic of China. The bill shall
5 be considered as read for amendment. The amendments
6 recommended by the Committee on International Rela-
7 tions now printed in the bill and the amendments printed

1 in part 1–A of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
2 companying this resolution shall be considered as adopted.
3 All points of order against the bill, as amended, are
4 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-
5 dered on the bill, as amended, and any further amendment
6 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:
7 (1) one hour of debate on the bill, as amended, which shall
8 be equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
9 ranking minority member of the Committee on Inter-
10 national Relations or their designees; (2) the further
11 amendment specified in part 1–B of the report of the
12 Committee on Rules, if offered by Representative Gilman
13 or his designee, which shall be in order without interven-
14 tion of any point of order, shall be considered as read,
15 and shall be separately debatable for thirty minutes equal-
16 ly divided and controlled by the proponent and an oppo-
17 nent; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without in-
18 structions.

19 SEC. 2. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
20 ther proceedings on H.R. 2232, it shall be in order without
21 intervention of any point of order to consider in the House
22 the bill (H.R. 2195) to provide for certain measures to
23 increase monitoring of products of the People’s Republic
24 of China that are made with forced labor. The bill shall
25 be considered as read for amendment. The amendment in

1 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
2 on Ways and Means now printed in the bill shall be consid-
3 ered as adopted. The previous question shall be considered
4 as ordered on the bill, as amended, to final passage with-
5 out intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate on
6 the bill, as amended, which shall be equally divided and
7 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
8 of the Committee on Ways and Means or their designees;
9 and (2) one motion to recommit with or without instruc-
10 tions.

11 SEC. 3. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
12 ther proceedings on H.R. 2195, it shall be in order to con-
13 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 188) urging
14 the executive branch to take action regarding the acquisi-
15 tion by Iran of C-802 cruise missiles. The resolution shall
16 be considered as read for amendment. The amendments
17 printed in part 2 of the report of the Committee on Rules
18 shall be considered as adopted. The previous question shall
19 be considered as ordered on the resolution and the pre-
20 amble, as amended, to final adoption without intervening
21 motion except: (1) one hour of debate on the resolution,
22 as amended, which shall be equally divided and controlled
23 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the
24 Committee on International Relations or their designees;

1 and (2) one motion to recommit with or without instruc-
2 tions.

3 SEC. 4. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
4 ther proceedings on H. Res. 188, it shall be in order to
5 consider in the House the bill (H.R. 967) to prohibit the
6 use of United States funds to provide for the participation
7 of certain Chinese officials in international conferences,
8 programs, and activities and to provide that certain Chi-
9 nese officials shall be ineligible to receive visas and ex-
10 cluded from admission to the United States. The bill shall
11 be considered as read for amendment. The amendments
12 recommended by the Committee on International Rela-
13 tions now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopt-
14 ed. The previous question shall be considered as ordered
15 on the bill, as amended, to final passage without interven-
16 ing motion except: (1) one hour of debate on the bill, as
17 amended, which shall be equally divided and controlled by
18 the chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-
19 mittee on International Relations or their designees; and
20 (2) one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

21 SEC. 5. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
22 ther proceedings on H.R. 967, it shall be in order to con-
23 sider in the House the bill (H.R. 2570) to condemn those
24 officials of the Chinese Communist Party, the Government
25 of the People's Republic of China, and other persons who

1 are involved in the enforcement of forced abortions by pre-
2 venting such persons from entering or remaining in the
3 United States. The bill shall be considered as read for
4 amendment. The amendment printed in part 3 of the re-
5 port of the Committee on Rules shall be considered as
6 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
7 dered on the bill, as amended, to final passage without
8 intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally
9 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
10 nority member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their
11 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit with or without
12 instructions.

13 SEC. 6. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
14 ther proceedings on H.R. 2570, it shall be in order to con-
15 sider in the House the bill (H.R. 2386) to implement the
16 provisions of the Taiwan Relations Act concerning the sta-
17 bility and security of Taiwan and United States coopera-
18 tion with Taiwan on the development and acquisition of
19 defensive military articles. The bill shall be considered as
20 read for amendment. The amendment in the nature of a
21 substitute recommended by the Committee on Inter-
22 national Relations now printed in the bill, modified by the
23 amendments printed in part 4 of the report of the Com-
24 mittee on Rules, shall be considered as adopted. The pre-
25 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,

1 as amended, to final passage without intervening motion
2 except: (1) one hour of debate on the bill, as amended,
3 which shall be equally divided and controlled by the chair-
4 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
5 International Relations or their designees; and (2) one mo-
6 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

7 SEC. 7. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
8 ther proceedings on H.R. 2386, it shall be in order to con-
9 sider in the House the bill (H.R. 2605) to require the
10 United States to oppose the making of concessional loans
11 by international financial institutions to any entity in the
12 People's Republic of China. The bill shall be considered
13 as read for amendment. The amendments printed in part
14 5 of the report of the Committee on Rules shall be consid-
15 ered as adopted. The previous question shall be considered
16 as ordered on the bill, as amended, to final passage with-
17 out intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate on
18 the bill, as amended, which shall be equally divided and
19 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
20 of the Committee on Banking and Financial Services or
21 their designees; and (2) one motion to recommit with or
22 without instructions.

23 SEC. 8. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
24 ther proceedings on H.R. 2605, it shall be in order to con-
25 sider in the House the bill (H.R. 2647) to ensure that

1 commercial activities of the People's Liberation Army of
2 China or any Communist Chinese military company in the
3 United States are monitored and are subject to the au-
4 thorities under the International Emergency Economic
5 Powers Act. The bill shall be considered as read for
6 amendment. The previous question shall be considered as
7 ordered on the bill to final passage without intervening
8 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
9 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
10 of the Committee on International Relations or their des-
11 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

12 SEC. 9. After disposition of or postponement of fur-
13 ther proceedings on H.R. 2647, it shall be in order to con-
14 sider in the House the bill (H.R. 2232) to provide for in-
15 creased international broadcasting activities in China. The
16 bill shall be considered as read for amendment. The
17 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by
18 the Committee on International Relations now printed in
19 the bill shall be considered as adopted. The previous ques-
20 tion shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended,
21 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
22 hour of debate on the bill, as amended, which shall be
23 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
24 ing minority member of the Committee on International

1 Relations or their designees; and (2) one motion to recom-
2 mit with or without instructions.

3 SEC. 10. During consideration of any measure pursu-
4 ant to this resolution, the list of questions on which the
5 Chair may postpone proceedings under clause 5(b)(1) of
6 rule I shall be considered to include (as though in one of
7 the subdivisions (A) through (E)) both the question of
8 adopting an amendment and the question of adopting a
9 motion to recommit.

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
