Ms. PRYCE of Ohio, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3494) to amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to violent sex crimes against children, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3494) to amend title 18, United
6 States Code, with respect to violent sex crimes against

1 children, and for other purposes. The first reading of the
2 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against
3 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall
4 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-
5 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
6 nority member of the Committee on the Judiciary. After
7 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
8 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider
9 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
10 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
11 stitute recommended by the Committee on the Judiciary
12 now printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the
13 nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. All
14 points of order against the committee amendment in the
15 nature of a substitute are waived. No amendment to the
16 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall
17 be in order except those printed in the report of the Com-
18 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each
19 amendment may be offered only in the order printed in
20 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated
21 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-
22 able for the time specified in the report equally divided
23 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall
24 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
25 a demand for division of the question in the House or in

1 the Committee of the Whole. All Points of order against
2 the amendments printed in the report are waived. The
3 chairman of the Committee of the Whole may: (1) post-
4 pone until a time during further consideration in the Com-
5 mittee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any
6 amendment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum
7 time for electronic voting on any postponed question that
8 follows another electronic vote without intervening busi-
9 ness, provided that the minimum time for electronic voting
10 on the first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes.
11 At the conclusion of consideration of the bill of amend-
12 ment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the
13 House with such amendments as may have been adopted.
14 Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House
15 on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole
16 to the bill or to the committee amendment in the nature
17 of a substitute. The previous question shall be considered
18 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
19 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
20 recommit with or without instructions.
