Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4104) making appropriations for the Treasury Department, the United States Postal Service, the Executive Office of the President, and certain Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4104) making appropriations for

1 the Treasury Department, the United States Postal Serv-  
2 ice, the Executive Office of the President, and certain  
3 Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending Septem-  
4 ber 30, 1999, and for other purposes. The first reading  
5 of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order against  
6 consideration of the bill for failure to comply with section  
7 306 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived.  
8 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not  
9 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the  
10 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee  
11 on Appropriations. After general debate the bill shall be  
12 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule.  
13 Points of order against section 628 for failure to comply  
14 with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived. During consider-  
15 ation of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Com-  
16 mittee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on  
17 the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment  
18 has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congres-  
19 sional Record designated for that purpose in clause 6 of  
20 rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered  
21 as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
22 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-  
23 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-  
24 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
25 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any

1 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
2 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
3 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
4 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
5 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
6 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
7 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall  
8 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments  
9 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except  
10 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
