Mr. DREIER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4328) making appropriations for the Department of Transportation and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4328) making appropriations for  
6 the Department of Transportation and related agencies

1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for  
2 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-  
3 pensed with. Points of order against consideration of the  
4 bill for failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XXI or sec-  
5 tion 401(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are  
6 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and  
7 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled  
8 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the  
9 Committee on Appropriations. After general debate the  
10 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
11 minute rule. The amendments printed in the report of the  
12 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be  
13 considered as adopted in the House and in the Committee  
14 of the Whole. Points of order against provisions in the  
15 bill, as amended, for failure to comply with clause 2 or  
16 6 of rule XXI are waived except as follows: beginning with  
17 “, of which”, on page 11, line 19, through “Fund” on  
18 line 20; page 16, lines 20 through 24; beginning with “:  
19 Provided” on page 18, line 2, through “motor carriers”  
20 on line 5; and page 54, lines 4 through 8. Where points  
21 of order are waived against part of a paragraph, points  
22 of order against a provision in another part of such para-  
23 graph may be made only against such provision and not  
24 against the entire paragraph. During consideration of the  
25 bill for further amendment, the Chairman of the Commit-

tee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any postponed question that follows another electronic vote without intervening business, provided that the minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to the House with such further amendments as may have been adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
