Mrs. MYRICK, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4300) to support enhanced drug interdiction efforts in the major transit countries and support a comprehensive supply eradication and crop substitution program in source countries.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4300) to support enhanced drug

1 interdiction efforts in the major transit countries and sup-
2 port a comprehensive supply eradication and crop substi-
3 tution program in source countries. The first reading of
4 the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be
5 confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally
6 divided and controlled by Representative Hastert of Illi-
7 nois, and a Member opposed to the bill. After general de-
8 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the
9 five-minute rule for a period not to exceed three hours.
10 It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the
11 purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule the
12 amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in the
13 Congressional Record and numbered 1 pursuant to clause
14 6 of rule XXIII. That amendment in the nature of a sub-
15 stitute shall be considered as read. Points of order against
16 that amendment in the nature of a substitute for failure
17 to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI are waived. During
18 consideration of the bill for amendments, the Chairman
19 of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-
20 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an
21 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of
22 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in
23 clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be
24 considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the
25 Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further con-

1 sideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
2 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five
3 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any
4 postponed question that follows another electronic vote
5 without intervening business, provided that the minimum
6 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-
7 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-
8 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
9 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
10 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
11 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
12 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the amend-
13 ment in the nature of a substitute made in order as origi-
14 nal text. The previous question shall be considered as or-
15 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
16 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
17 with or without instruction.
