Mr. DREIER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4274) making appropriations for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and related agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4274) making appropriations for

1 the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services,  
2 and Education, and related agencies, for the fiscal year  
3 ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes. The  
4 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General  
5 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed  
6 90 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman  
7 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-  
8 priations. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
9 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order  
10 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with  
11 clause 2 or 6 of rule XXI are waived except as follows:  
12 beginning with “: *Provided*” on page 41, line 9, through  
13 line 19; page 95, line 18, through page 109, line 19.  
14 Where points of order are waived against part of a para-  
15 graph, points of order against a provision in another part  
16 of such paragraph may be made only against such provi-  
17 sion and not against the entire paragraph. The amend-  
18 ments printed in the report of the Committee on Rules  
19 accompanying this resolution may be offered only by a  
20 Member designated in the report and only at the appro-  
21 priate point in the reading of the bill, shall be considered  
22 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the  
23 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and  
24 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment except  
25 as specified in the report, and shall not be subject to a

1 demand for division of the question in the House or in  
2 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against  
3 the amendments printed in the report are waived. During  
4 consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of  
5 the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-  
6 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an  
7 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of  
8 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in  
9 clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be  
10 considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the  
11 Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further con-  
12 sideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for  
13 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
14 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
15 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
16 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
17 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
18 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
19 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
20 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
21 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall  
22 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments  
23 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except  
24 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
