Ms. PRYCE of Ohio, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1) to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to provide compensatory time for employees in the private sector.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1) to amend the Fair Labor Stand-
6 ards Act of 1938 to provide compensatory time for em-

1 ployees in the private sector. The first reading of the bill
2 shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined
3 to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided
4 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
5 member of the Committee on Education and the
6 Workforce. After general debate the bill shall be consid-
7 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall
8 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose
9 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment
10 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Commit-
11 tee on Education and the Workforce now printed in the
12 bill. The committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
13 stitute shall be considered as read. No amendment shall
14 be in order except those printed in the report of the Com-
15 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each
16 amendment may be considered only in the order printed
17 in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated
18 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-
19 able for the time specified in the report equally divided
20 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall
21 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
22 a demand for division of the question in the House or in
23 the Committee of the Whole. An amendment designated
24 to be offered by the chairman of the Committee on Edu-
25 cation and the Workforce or his designee may be offered

1 en bloc with one or more other such amendments. At the
2 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
3 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
4 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member
5 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-
6 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill
7 or to the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
8 stitute. The previous question shall be considered as or-
9 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
10 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
11 with or without instructions.
