AN ACT

To deauthorize certain portions of the project for navigation,
Bass Harbor, Maine.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. BASS HARBOR, MAINE.**

2 (a) DEAUTHORIZATION.—The portions of the project
3 for navigation, Bass Harbor, Maine, authorized on May
4 7, 1962, under section 107 of the River and Harbor Act
5 of 1960 (33 U.S.C. 577), that are described in subsection
6 (b) are not authorized after the date of enactment of this
7 Act.

8 (b) DESCRIPTION.—The portions of the project re-
9 ferred to in subsection (a) are described as follows:

10 (1) Beginning at a bend in the project,
11 N149040.00, E538505.00, thence running easterly
12 about 50.00 feet along the northern limit of the
13 project to a point N149061.55, E538550.11, thence
14 running southerly about 642.08 feet to a point,
15 N148477.64, E538817.18, thence running south-
16 westerly about 156.27 feet to a point on the westerly
17 limit of the project, N148348.50, E538737.02,
18 thence running northerly about 149.00 feet along
19 the westerly limit of the project to a bend in the
20 project, N148489.22, E538768.09, thence running
21 northwesterly about 610.39 feet along the westerly
22 limit of the project to the point of origin.

23 (2) Beginning at a point on the westerly limit
24 of the project, N148118.55, E538689.05, thence
25 running southeasterly about 91.92 feet to a point,
26 N148041.43, E538739.07, thence running southerly

1 about 65.00 feet to a point, N147977.86,
2 E538725.51, thence running southwesterly about
3 91.92 feet to a point on the westerly limit of the
4 project, N147927.84, E538648.39, thence running
5 northerly about 195.00 feet along the westerly limit
6 of the project to the point of origin.
