Mr. TORRICELLI introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

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## A BILL

To provide increased funding to combat drug offenses, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Drug Elimination and  
5       Justice Act”.

6       **SEC. 2. AFTER SCHOOLS AND LIFE SKILLS PROGRAMS FOR**  
7       **AT-RISK YOUTH.**

8       Section 10907 of part I of title X of the Elementary  
9       and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 8247)  
10      is amended by striking “appropriated” and all that follows

1 before the period and inserting the following: “appro-  
2 priated to carry out this part—

3           “(1) such sums as may be necessary for fiscal  
4       year 1999; and

5           “(2) a total of \$1,000,000,000 for fiscal years  
6       2000 through 2004”.

7 **SEC. 3. INCREASED LAW ENFORCEMENT RESOURCES IN SE-**  
8 **LECTED CITIES.**

9       (a) **FEDERAL DRUG COURT PILOT PROGRAM.—**

10 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Drug Court  
11 Program Office of the Office of Justice Programs of the  
12 Department of Justice, \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal  
13 years 2000 through 2002, to carry out a pilot program  
14 to establish a Federal drug court in each of 10 cities in  
15 the United States that have increasing drug enforcement  
16 problems.

17       (b) **INCREASED PROSECUTORIAL RESOURCES.—**

18 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Department  
19 of Justice, \$3,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2000  
20 through 2002, for additional prosecutorial resources, in-  
21 cluding personnel, dedicated to drug enforcement, in each  
22 of the 10 cities in which a Federal drug court is estab-  
23 lished pursuant to subsection (a).

1 **SEC. 4. INCREASED FUNDING FOR THE COPS PROGRAM.**

2 Section 1001(a)(11) of part J of title I of the Omni-  
3 bus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42  
4 U.S.C. 3793(a)(11)) is amended by adding at the end the  
5 following:

6 “(C) In addition to amounts made available under  
7 subparagraph (A), there is authorized to be appropriated  
8 to carry out part Q, to remain available until expended,  
9 the total amount of \$1,500,000,000 for fiscal years 2000  
10 through 2004, of which 50 percent shall be used for coop-  
11 erative partnerships between schools and State and local  
12 police departments to provide for the use of police officers  
13 in schools.”.

14 **SEC. 5. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR DRUG CRIMES NEAR**  
15 **SCHOOLS.**

16 Section 419 of the Controlled Substances Act (21  
17 U.S.C. 860) is amended—

18 (1) in subsection (a)—

19 (A) by inserting “public library,” after  
20 “swimming pool,”; and

21 (B) by striking “one year” and inserting  
22 “3 years”; and

23 (2) in subsection (b)—

24 (A) by inserting “public library,” after  
25 “swimming pool,”; and

- 1 (B) by striking “three years” and inserting
- 2 “7 years”.
