1 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR FRAUDU-**
2 **LENT DISPOSITION OF ASSETS IN ORDER TO**
3 **OBTAIN MEDICAID BENEFITS.**

4 (a) REPEAL.—Section 1128B(a) of the Social Secu-
5 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1320a–7b(a)), as amended by section
6 217 of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountabil-
7 ity Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–191; 110 Stat. 2008),
8 is amended—

- 9 (1) by adding “or” at the end of paragraph (4);
10 (2) by striking “or” at the end of paragraph
11 (5) and inserting a comma; and
12 (3) by striking paragraph (6).

13 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
14 subsection (a) take effect as if included in the enactment
15 of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability
16 Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–191; 110 Stat. 1936).

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
