A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to States that do not give full faith and credit to the protective orders of other States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FULL FAITH AND CREDIT GIVEN TO PROTEC-**
4 **TIVE ORDERS.**

5 Section 2265 of title 18, United States Code, is
6 amended by adding at the end the following:

7 “(d) FORMULA GRANT REDUCTION FOR NONCOMPLI-
8 ANCE.—

9 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Beginning with the second
10 fiscal year commencing after the date of enactment

1 of this subsection, and in each fiscal year thereafter,
2 if a State is not in compliance with subsections (a)
3 and (b), the Attorney General shall reduce by 10
4 percent the amount that the State would otherwise
5 receive for that fiscal year under subpart 1 of part
6 E of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
7 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3751 et seq.).

8 “(2) REDISTRIBUTION OF AMOUNTS.—In any
9 fiscal year, the total amount remaining for distribu-
10 tion under subpart 1 of part E of title I of the Om-
11 nibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968
12 (42 U.S.C. 3751 et seq.) by operation of paragraph
13 (1), shall be distributed on a pro rata basis among
14 States that—

15 “(A) are eligible to receive a grant under
16 subpart 1 of part E of title I of the Omnibus
17 Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968
18 (42 U.S.C. 3751 et seq.); and

19 “(B) are in compliance with subsections
20 (a) and (b) of this section.”.
