A BILL

To amend the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act to clarify that a State is not required to provide special education and related services to a person with a disability who is convicted of a felony and incarcerated in a secure correctional facility with adult offenders.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. CLARIFICATION ON THE PROVISION OF SPE-**
2 **CIAL EDUCATION AND RELATED SERVICES**
3 **TO CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES WHO ARE**
4 **CONVICTED OF FELONIES.**

5 Section 612(1) of the Individuals with Disabilities
6 Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1412(1)) is amended by adding
7 at end the following: “The State is not required under the
8 policy to assure a free appropriate public education to a
9 person with a disability who is convicted of a felony and
10 as a result of such a conviction, is incarcerated in a secure
11 correctional facility. ”.

12 (b) DEFINITIONS.—Section 602(a) of the Individuals
13 with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1401(a)) is
14 amended by adding at the end the following:

15 “(28) The term “secure correctional facility”
16 means any public or private residential facility
17 that—

18 “(A) includes construction fixtures de-
19 signed to physically restrict the movements and
20 activities of individuals held in lawful custody in
21 such facility; and

22 “(B) is used for the placement, after adju-
23 dication and disposition, of an individual con-
24 victed of a criminal offense.”.
