CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To permit the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a congressional ceremony honoring Mother Teresa.

- 1 Whereas Mother Teresa of Calcutta has greatly enhanced
 - 2 the lives of people in all walks of life in every corner
 - 3 of the world through her faith, her love, and her self-
 - 4 less dedication to humanity and charitable works for
 - 5 nearly 70 years;
 - 6 Whereas Mother Teresa founded the Missionaries of Char-
 - 7 ity, which includes more than 3,000 members in 25
 - 8 countries who devote their lives to serving the poor,
 - 9 without accepting any material reward in return;

1 Whereas Mother Teresa has been recognized as an out-
2 standing humanitarian around the world and has been
3 honored by: the first Pope John XXIII Peace Prize
4 (1971); the Jawaharal Nehru Award for International
5 Understanding (1972); the Nobel Peace Prize (1979);
6 and the Presidential Medal of Freedom (1985).

7 Whereas Mother Teresa has forever enhanced the culture
8 and history of the world; and

9 Whereas Mother Teresa truly leads by example and shows
10 the people of the world the way to live by love for
11 all humanity: Now, therefore, be it

12 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
13 *concurring),* That the rotunda of the Capitol is authorized
14 to be used on June 5, 1997, for a congressional ceremony
15 honoring Mother Teresa. Physical preparations for the
16 ceremony shall be carried out in accordance with such con-
17 ditions as the Architect of the Capitol may prescribe.
