## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National  
SAFE KIDS Campaign SAFE KIDS Buckle Up Car  
Seat Check Up.

1        *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*  
2        *concurring),*

3        **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**  
4                                **SAFE KIDS CAMPAIGN SAFE KIDS BUCKLE UP**  
5                                **SAFETY CHECK.**

6        The National SAFE KIDS Campaign and its auxil-  
7        iary may sponsor a public event on the Capitol Grounds  
8        on August 27 and August 28, 1997, or on such other date  
9        as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the

1 President pro tempore of the Senate may jointly des-  
2 ignate.

3 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized under sec-  
5 tion 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and  
6 arranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress,  
7 under conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the  
8 Capitol and the Capitol Police.

9 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The National  
10 SAFE KIDS Campaign and its auxiliary shall assume full  
11 responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident to all  
12 activities associated with the event.

13 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

14 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the  
15 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the National  
16 SAFE KIDS Campaign and its agents are authorized to  
17 erect upon the Capitol Grounds any stage, sound amplifi-  
18 cation devices, and other related structures and equipment  
19 required for the event authorized under section 1.

20 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of  
21 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized  
22 to make any other reasonable arrangements as may be re-  
23 quired to plan for or administer the event.
