RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of the Interior should support the establishment of a memorial to Thomas Paine on the National Park Service property in Constitution Gardens within the 1700 block of Constitution Avenue, N.W., in the District of Columbia, and that the memorial should specifically include the structure known as the “Canal House”.

1 SECTION 1. THOMAS PAINE MEMORIAL.

2 It is the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of
3 the Interior should support the establishment of a memo-

1 rial to Thomas Paine in the District of Columbia, as au-
2 thorized by Public Law 102–407 (40 U.S.C. 1003 note).

3 **SEC. 2. LOCATION OF MEMORIAL.**

4 The memorial described in section 1 should—

5 (1) be established on the National Park Service
6 property in Constitution Gardens within the 1700
7 block of Constitution Avenue, N.W., in the District
8 of Columbia; and

9 (2) specifically include the structure known as
10 the “Canal House”, to be used by the Thomas Paine
11 National Historical Association U.S.A. Memorial
12 Foundation as an integral part of the memorial, in
13 a manner determined by the National Park Service
14 and the Thomas Paine National Historical Associa-
15 tion U.S.A. Memorial Foundation.
