CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the Architect of the Capitol to permit temporary construction and other work on the Capitol Grounds that may be necessary for construction of a building on Constitution Avenue Northwest, between 2nd Street Northwest and Louisiana Avenue Northwest.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

4 The Architect of the Capitol may permit temporary
5 construction and other work on the Capitol Grounds that
6 may be necessary for construction of a building on Con-
7 stitution Avenue Northwest, between 2nd Street North-

1 west and Louisiana Avenue Northwest. Such work may
2 include activities resulting in temporary obstruction of a
3 curbside parking lane on Louisiana Avenue Northwest and
4 on Constitution Avenue Northwest, between 2nd Street
5 Northwest and Louisiana Avenue Northwest.

6 **SEC. 2. PERIOD OF USE.**

7 Work on the Capitol Grounds under section 1 is au-
8 thorized during the period beginning August 6, 1999, and
9 ending October 31, 2001, or such longer period as the Ar-
10 chitect of the Capitol determines necessary.

11 **SEC. 3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—Work on the Capitol Grounds
13 under section 1 may not begin until the Architect of the
14 Capitol receives such assurances as the Architect may re-
15 quire to ensure that—

16 (1) all areas of the Capitol Grounds that are
17 disturbed by reason of such work will be restored to
18 their original condition without expense to the
19 United States; and

20 (2) such work will be carried out so as not to
21 interfere with the needs of Congress, under condi-
22 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Cap-
23 itol.

24 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The United
25 States shall not incur any expense or liability incident to

1 any activity associated with work on the Capitol Grounds

2 under section 1.
