CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing printing of the brochures entitled “How Our Laws Are Made” and “Our American Government”, the pocket version of the United States Constitution, and the document-sized, annotated version of the United States Constitution.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. PRINTING OF DOCUMENTS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Each of the documents referred
5 to in section 2 shall be printed as a House document, in

1 a style and manner determined by the Chair of the Joint
2 Committee on Printing.

3 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES FOR HOUSE AND SEN-
4 ATE.—There shall be printed for the use of the House of
5 Representatives and the Senate an aggregate number of
6 copies of the documents printed under subsection (a) not
7 to exceed the lesser of—

8 (1) 2,200,000; or

9 (2) the maximum number of copies for which
10 the aggregate printing cost does not exceed an
11 amount established by the Joint Committee on
12 Printing.

13 **SEC. 2. DOCUMENTS DESCRIBED.**

14 The documents referred to in this section are as fol-
15 lows:

16 (1) The 1999 revised edition of the brochure
17 entitled “How Our Laws Are Made”.

18 (2) The 1999 revised edition of the brochure
19 entitled “Our American Government”.

20 (3) The 20th edition of the pocket version of
21 the United States Constitution.

1 (4) The 1999 edition of the document-sized, an-
2 notated version of the United States Constitution.
