Mr. COLLINS submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress that the House of Heroes project in Columbus, Georgia, should serve as a model for public service support for the Nation's veterans.

Whereas the veterans of the United States have made immeasurable sacrifices for the preservation of freedom for America;

Whereas the people of Columbus, Georgia, have demonstrated an appreciation for the commitments made by veterans and their families, through the House of Heroes project;

Whereas the House of Heroes project was created specifically to honor veterans and their families by providing assistance with repair, maintenance, and improvement of veterans' primary residences; and

Whereas the House of Heroes project is comprised of volunteers from the Columbus, Georgia, area representing a broad cross section of the local community, including military personnel, businesses, trade organizations, Federal and local Governments, charitable funds, and individual citizens who have joined together to support local veterans who have played such an important role in the long-term preservation of freedom in this country: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that the House of Heroes project of Columbus, Georgia, should serve as a public service model for communities across the United States effectively to provide needed assistance and support for veterans who so bravely served their communities and their country.
