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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 18th  
annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2   *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**  
2 **PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

3 The National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-  
4 iary shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, the eight-  
5 eenth annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service,  
6 on the Capitol Grounds on May 15, 1999, or on such other  
7 date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and  
8 the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate  
9 may jointly designate, in order to honor the more than  
10 160 law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty  
11 during 1998.

12 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

13 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The event authorized by section  
14 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-  
15 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under  
16 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol  
17 and the Capitol Police Board.

18 (b) **EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.**—The National  
19 Fraternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall assume  
20 full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident  
21 to all activities associated with the event.

22 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

23 (a) **STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**—Subject to the  
24 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the National Fra-  
25 ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary are authorized to  
26 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-

1 cation devices, and other related structures and equip-  
2 ment, as may be required for the event authorized by sec-  
3 tion 1.

4 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

5       The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
6 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act  
7 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-  
8 cerning sales, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol  
9 Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the  
10 Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event authorized by  
11 section 1.
