CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the opening ceremonies of Sunrayce 99.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR OPENING**
4 **CEREMONIES OF SUNRAYCE 99.**

5 The organizers of Sunrayce 99 (in this resolution re-
6 ferred to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor

1 a public event, with solar-powered cars, on the Capitol
2 Grounds on June 20, 1999, or on such other dates as the
3 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Commit-
4 tee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly
5 designate, to conduct opening ceremonies for Sunrayce 99.

6 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section
8 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-
9 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under
10 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol
11 and the Capitol Police Board.

12 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
13 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
14 incident to all activities associated with the event.

15 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

16 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
17 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
18 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-
19 cation devices, and other related structures and equipment
20 as may be required for the event authorized by section
21 1.

22 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
23 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
24 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
25 quired to carry out the event, including arrangements to

1 limit access to First Street between Independence Avenue
2 Southwest and Constitution Avenue Northwest.

3 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

4 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
5 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
6 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concern-
7 ing sales, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol
8 Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the
9 Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event authorized by
10 section 1.

11 **SEC. 5. LIMITATION ON REPRESENTATIONS.**

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized by section
13 1 may be conducted only after the Architect of the Capitol
14 and the Capitol Police Board enter into an agreement with
15 the sponsor that prohibits the sponsor—

16 (1) from representing, either directly or indi-
17 rectly, that this resolution or any activity carried out
18 under this resolution in any way constitutes approval
19 or endorsement by the Federal Government of any
20 product or service offered by the sponsor; and

21 (2) from using any photograph taken at the
22 event for a commercial purpose.

23 (b) PENALTIES.—The agreement shall provide for fi-
24 nancial penalties to be imposed if any photograph is used
25 in violation of this section.

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
