A BILL

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for military operations, refugee relief, and humanitarian assistance relating to the conflict in Kosovo, and for military operations in Southwest Asia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the

1 fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other pur-
2 poses, namely:

3 **CHAPTER 1**

4 DEPARTMENT OF STATE

5 ADMINISTRATION OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

6 DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR PROGRAMS

7 Notwithstanding section 15 of the State Department
8 Basic Authorities Act of 1956, an additional amount for
9 “Diplomatic and Consular Programs”, \$17,071,000, to re-
10 main available until expended: *Provided*, That the entire
11 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
12 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
13 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
14 as amended.

15 SECURITY AND MAINTENANCE OF UNITED STATES

16 MISSIONS

17 Notwithstanding section 15 of the State Department
18 Basic Authorities Act of 1956, an additional amount for
19 “Security and Maintenance of United States Missions”,
20 \$50,500,000, to remain available until expended, of which
21 \$45,500,000 shall be available only to the extent that an
22 official budget request for a specific dollar amount that
23 includes the designation of the entire amount of the re-
24 quest as an emergency requirement as defined in the Bal-
25 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
26 as amended, is transmitted by the President to the Con-

1 MILITARY PERSONNEL, NAVY

2 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
3 Navy”, \$7,660,000: *Provided*, That such amount is des-
4 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement
5 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget
6 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

7 MILITARY PERSONNEL, MARINE CORPS

8 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
9 Marine Corps”, \$1,586,000: *Provided*, That such amount
10 is designated by the Congress as an emergency require-
11 ment pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced
12 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as
13 amended.

14 MILITARY PERSONNEL, AIR FORCE

15 For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,
16 Air Force”, \$4,303,000: *Provided*, That such amount is
17 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement
18 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget
19 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

20 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

21 OVERSEAS CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS TRANSFER FUND

22 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

23 For an additional amount for “Overseas Contingency
24 Operations Transfer Fund”, \$5,219,100,000, to remain
25 available until expended: *Provided*, That the entire amount

1 made available under this heading is designated by the
2 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-
3 tion 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
4 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further,*
5 That of such amount, \$1,311,800,000 shall be available
6 only to the extent that the President transmits to the Con-
7 gress an official budget request for a specific dollar
8 amount that (1) specifies items which meet a critical read-
9 iness or sustainability need, to include replacement of ex-
10 pended munitions to maintain adequate inventories for fu-
11 ture operations, and (2) includes designation of the entire
12 amount of the request as an emergency requirement as
13 defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
14 Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further,* That
15 the Secretary of Defense may transfer these funds only
16 to military personnel accounts; operation and maintenance
17 accounts, including Overseas Humanitarian, Disaster, and
18 Civic Aid; procurement accounts; research, development,
19 test and evaluation accounts; military construction; the
20 Defense Health Program appropriation; the National De-
21 fense Sealift Fund; and working capital fund accounts:
22 *Provided further,* That the funds transferred shall be
23 merged with and shall be available for the same purposes
24 and for the same time period, as the appropriation to
25 which transferred: *Provided further,* That the transfer au-

1 thority provided under this heading is in addition to any
2 other transfer authority available to the Department of
3 Defense: *Provided further*, That such funds may be used
4 to execute projects or programs that were deferred in
5 order to carry out military operations in and around
6 Kosovo and in Southwest Asia, including efforts associated
7 with the displaced Kosovar population: *Provided further*,
8 That upon a determination that all or part of the funds
9 transferred from this appropriation are not necessary for
10 the purposes provided herein, such amounts may be trans-
11 ferred back to this appropriation.

12 PROCUREMENT

13 WEAPONS PROCUREMENT, NAVY

14 For an additional amount for “Weapons Procure-
15 ment, Navy”, \$431,100,000, to remain available for obli-
16 gation until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That such
17 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
18 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
19 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
20 as amended.

21 AIRCRAFT PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

22 For an additional amount for “Aircraft Procurement,
23 Air Force”, \$40,000,000, to remain available for obliga-
24 tion until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That such
25 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency

1 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
3 as amended.

4 MISSILE PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

5 For an additional amount for “Missile Procurement,
6 Air Force”, \$178,200,000, to remain available for obliga-
7 tion until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That such
8 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
9 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
10 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
11 as amended.

12 PROCUREMENT OF AMMUNITION, AIR FORCE

13 For an additional amount for “Procurement of Am-
14 muniton, Air Force”, \$35,000,000, to remain available
15 for obligation until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That
16 such amount is designated by the Congress as an emer-
17 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the
18 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
19 1985, as amended.

20 OPERATIONAL RAPID RESPONSE TRANSFER FUND

21 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

22 In addition to the amounts appropriated or otherwise
23 made available in this Act and the Department of Defense
24 Appropriations Act, 1999 (Public Law 105–262),
25 \$400,000,000, to remain available for obligation until Sep-

1 tember 30, 2000, is hereby made available only for the
2 accelerated acquisition and deployment of military tech-
3 nologies and systems needed for the conduct of Operation
4 Allied Force, or to provide accelerated acquisition and de-
5 ployment of military technologies and systems as sub-
6 stitute or replacement systems for other U.S. regional
7 commands which have had assets diverted as a result of
8 Operation Allied Force: *Provided*, That funds under this
9 heading may only be obligated in response to a specific
10 request from a U.S. regional command and upon approval
11 of the Secretary of Defense, or his designate: *Provided fur-*
12 *ther*, That the Secretary of Defense shall provide written
13 notification to the congressional defense committees prior
14 to the transfer of any amount in excess of \$10,000,000
15 to a specific program or project: *Provided further*, That
16 the Secretary of Defense may transfer funds made avail-
17 able under this heading only to operation and maintenance
18 accounts, procurement accounts, and research, develop-
19 ment, test and evaluation accounts: *Provided further*, That
20 the transfer authority provided under this section shall be
21 in addition to the transfer authority provided to the De-
22 partment of Defense in this Act or any other Act: *Provided*
23 *further*, That the entire amount made available in this sec-
24 tion is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-
25 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-

1 by the Congress for purposes of section 504 of the Na-
2 tional Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 414).

3 SEC. 204. Notwithstanding section 5064(d) of the
4 Federal Acquisition Streamlining Act of 1994 (Public Law
5 103–355), the special authorities provided under section
6 5064(c) of such Act shall continue to apply with respect
7 to contracts awarded or modified for the Joint Direct At-
8 tack Munition (JDAM) program until June 30, 2000: *Pro-*
9 *vided*, That a contract or modification to a contract for
10 the JDAM program may be awarded or executed notwith-
11 standing any advance notification requirements that would
12 otherwise apply.

13 SEC. 205. (a) EFFORTS TO INCREASE
14 BURDENSARING.—The President shall seek equitable re-
15 imbursement from the North Atlantic Treaty Organization
16 (NATO), member nations of NATO, and other appro-
17 priate organizations and nations for the costs incurred by
18 the United States government in connection with Oper-
19 ation Allied Force.

20 (b) REPORT.—Not later than September 30, 1999,
21 the President shall prepare and submit to the Congress
22 a report on—

23 (1) All measures taken by the President pursu-
24 ant to subsection (a);

1 (2) The amount of reimbursement received to
2 date from each organization and nation pursuant to
3 subsection (a), including a description of any com-
4 mitments made by such organization or nation to
5 provide reimbursement; and

6 (3) In the case of an organization or nation
7 that has refused to provide, or to commit to provide,
8 reimbursement pursuant to subsection (a), an expla-
9 nation of the reasons therefor.

10 (c) OPERATION ALLIED FORCE.—In this section, the
11 term “Operation Allied Force” means operations of the
12 North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) conducted
13 against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and
14 Montenegro) during the period beginning on March 24,
15 1999, and ending on such date as NATO may designate,
16 to resolve the conflict with respect to Kosovo.

17 SEC. 206. (a) Not more than thirty days after the
18 enactment of this Act, the President shall transmit to
19 Congress a report, in both classified and unclassified form,
20 on current United States participation in Operation Allied
21 Force. The report should include information on the fol-
22 lowing matters:

23 (1) A statement of the national security objec-
24 tives involved in U.S. participation in Operation Al-
25 lied Force;

1 (2) An accounting of all current active duty
2 personnel assigned to support Operation Allied
3 Force and related humanitarian operations around
4 Kosovo to include total number, service component
5 and area of deployment (such accounting should also
6 include total number of personnel from other NATO
7 countries participating in the action);

8 (3) Additional planned deployment of active
9 duty units in the European Command area of oper-
10 ations to support Operation Allied Force, between
11 the date of enactment of this Act and the end of fis-
12 cal year 1999;

13 (4) Additional planned Reserve component mo-
14 bilization, including specific units to be called up be-
15 tween the date of enactment of this Act and the end
16 of fiscal year 1999, to support Operation Allied
17 Force;

18 (5) An accounting by the Joint Chiefs of Staff
19 on the transfer of personnel and materiel from other
20 regional commands to the United States European
21 Command to support Operation Allied Force and re-
22 lated humanitarian operations around Kosovo, and
23 an assessment by the Joint Chiefs of Staff of the
24 impact any such loss of assets has had on the war-

1 fighting capabilities and deterrence value of these
2 other commands;

3 (6) Levels of humanitarian aid provided to the
4 displaced Kosovar community from the United
5 States, NATO member nations, and other nations
6 (figures should be provided by country and type of
7 assistance provided whether financial or in-kind);
8 and

9 (7) Any significant revisions to the total cost
10 estimate for the deployment of United States forces
11 involved in Operation Allied Force through the end
12 of fiscal year 1999.

13 (b) OPERATION ALLIED FORCE.—In this section, the
14 term “Operation Allied Force” means operations of the
15 North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) conducted
16 against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and
17 Montenegro) during the period beginning on March 24,
18 1999, and ending on such date as NATO may designate,
19 to resolve the conflict with respect to Kosovo.

20 SEC. 207. In addition to amounts appropriated or
21 otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the De-
22 partment of Defense or in the Department of Defense Ap-
23 propriations Act, 1999, \$1,339,200,000, to remain avail-
24 able for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby
25 appropriated to the Department of Defense only for spare

1 and repair parts and associated logistical support nec-
2 essary for the maintenance of weapons systems and equip-
3 ment, as follows:

4 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy”,
5 \$457,000,000;

6 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force”,
7 \$676,800,000;

8 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force Re-
9 serve”, \$24,000,000;

10 “Operation and Maintenance, Air National
11 Guard”, \$26,000,000;

12 “Aircraft Procurement, Navy”, \$118,000,000;

13 “Aircraft Procurement, Air Force”,
14 \$31,300,000; and

15 “Missile Procurement, Air Force”, \$6,100,000:

16 *Provided*, That the entire amount made available in this
17 section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-
18 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
19 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
20 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount
21 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
22 request for \$1,339,200,000, that includes designation of
23 the entire amount of the request as an emergency require-
24 ment as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency

1 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted
2 by the President to the Congress.

3 SEC. 208. In addition to amounts appropriated or
4 otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the De-
5 partment of Defense or in the Department of Defense Ap-
6 propriations Act, 1999, \$927,300,000, to remain available
7 for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby appro-
8 priated to the Department of Defense only for depot level
9 maintenance and repair, as follows:

10 "Operation and Maintenance, Army",
11 \$87,000,000;

12 "Operation and Maintenance, Navy",
13 \$428,700,000;

14 "Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps",
15 \$58,000,000;

16 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force",
17 \$314,300,000;

18 "Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps Re-
19 serve", \$3,000,000;

20 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force Re-
21 serve", \$6,800,000; and

22 "Operation and Maintenance, Air National
23 Guard", \$29,500,000:

24 *Provided*, That the entire amount made available in this
25 section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-

1 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
2 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
3 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount
4 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
5 request for \$927,300,000, that includes designation of the
6 entire amount of the request as an emergency requirement
7 as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
8 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
9 President to the Congress.

10 SEC. 209. In addition to amounts appropriated or
11 otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the De-
12 partment of Defense or in the Department of Defense Ap-
13 propriations Act, 1999, \$156,400,000, to remain available
14 for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby appro-
15 priated to the Department of Defense only for military
16 recruiting and advertising initiatives, as follows:

17 "Operation and Maintenance, Army",
18 \$48,600,000;

19 "Operation and Maintenance, Navy",
20 \$20,000,000;

21 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force",
22 \$37,000,000;

23 "Operation and Maintenance, Army Reserve",
24 \$29,800,000;

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy Reserve”,
2 \$1,000,000; and

3 “Operation and Maintenance, Army National
4 Guard”, \$20,000,000:

5 *Provided*, That the entire amount made available in this
6 section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-
7 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
8 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
9 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount
10 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
11 request for \$156,400,000, that includes designation of the
12 entire amount of the request as an emergency requirement
13 as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
14 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
15 President to the Congress.

16 SEC. 210. In addition to amounts appropriated or
17 otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the De-
18 partment of Defense or in the Department of Defense Ap-
19 propriations Act, 1999, \$307,300,000, to remain available
20 for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby appro-
21 priated to the Department of Defense only for military
22 training, equipment maintenance and associated support
23 costs required to meet assigned readiness levels of United
24 States military forces, as follows:

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Army”,
2 \$113,200,000;

3 “Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps”,
4 \$15,200,000;

5 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force”,
6 \$28,000,000;

7 “Operation and Maintenance, Army Reserve”,
8 \$88,400,000;

9 “Operation and Maintenance, Navy Reserve”,
10 \$600,000;

11 “Operation and Maintenance, Air Force Re-
12 serve”, \$11,900,000;

13 “Operation and Maintenance, Army National
14 Guard”, \$23,000,000; and

15 “Operation and Maintenance, Air National
16 Guard”, \$27,000,000:

17 *Provided*, That the entire amount made available in this
18 section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-
19 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
20 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
21 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount
22 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
23 request for \$307,300,000, that includes designation of the
24 entire amount of the request as an emergency requirement
25 as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit

1 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
2 President to the Congress.

3 SEC. 211. In addition to amounts appropriated or
4 otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the De-
5 partment of Defense or in the Department of Defense Ap-
6 propriations Act, 1999, \$351,500,000, to remain available
7 for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby appro-
8 priated to the Department of Defense only for base oper-
9 ations support costs at Department of Defense facilities,
10 as follows:

11 "Operation and Maintenance, Army",
12 \$116,200,000;

13 "Operation and Maintenance, Navy",
14 \$45,900,000;

15 "Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps",
16 \$53,000,000;

17 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force",
18 \$91,900,000;

19 "Operation and Maintenance, Army Reserve",
20 \$18,700,000;

21 "Operation and Maintenance, Navy Reserve",
22 \$13,800,000;

23 "Operation and Maintenance, Marine Corps Re-
24 serve", \$300,000; and

1 “Operation and Maintenance, Army National
2 Guard”, \$11,700,000:

3 *Provided*, That the entire amount made available in this
4 section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-
5 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
6 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
7 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount
8 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
9 request for \$351,500,000, that includes designation of the
10 entire amount of the request as an emergency requirement
11 as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
12 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
13 President to the Congress.

14 SEC. 212. (a) In addition to amounts appropriated
15 or otherwise made available to the Department of Defense
16 in other provisions of this Act, there is appropriated to
17 the Department of Defense, to remain available for obliga-
18 tion until September 30, 2000, and to be used only for
19 increases during fiscal year 2000 in rates of military basic
20 pay and for increased payments during fiscal year 2000
21 to the Department of Defense Military Retirement Fund,
22 \$1,838,426,000, to be available as follows:

23 “Military Personnel, Army”, \$559,533,000;

24 “Military Personnel, Navy”, \$436,773,000;

1 “Military Personnel, Marine Corps”,
2 \$177,980,000;
3 “Military Personnel, Air Force”, \$471,892,000;
4 “Reserve Personnel, Army”, \$40,574,000;
5 “Reserve Personnel, Navy”, \$29,833,000;
6 “Reserve Personnel, Marine Corps”,
7 \$7,820,000;
8 “Reserve Personnel, Air Force”, \$13,143,000;
9 “National Guard Personnel, Army”,
10 \$70,416,000; and
11 “National Guard Personnel, Air Force”,
12 \$30,462,000.

13 (b) The entire amount made available in this
14 section—

15 (1) is designated by the Congress as an emer-
16 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)
17 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Con-
18 trol Act of 1985, as amended (2 U.S.C.
19 901(b)(2)(A)); and

20 (2) shall be available only if the President
21 transmits to the Congress an official budget request
22 for \$1,838,426,000, that includes designation of the
23 entire amount of the request as an emergency re-
24 quirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and

1 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
2 President to the Congress.

3 OTHER BILATERAL ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE

4 ECONOMIC SUPPORT FUND

5 For an additional amount for “Economic Support
6 Fund”, \$105,000,000, to remain available until Sep-
7 tember 30, 2000, for assistance for Albania, Macedonia,
8 Bulgaria, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Montenegro, and Romania,
9 and for investigations and related activities in Kosovo and
10 in adjacent entities and countries regarding war crimes;
11 *Provided*, That these funds shall be available notwith-
12 standing any other provision of law except section 533 of
13 the Foreign Operations, Export Financing, and Related
14 Programs Appropriations Act, 1999 (as contained in divi-
15 sion A, section 101(d) of the Omnibus Consolidated and
16 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1999 (Pub-
17 lic Law 105–277)): *Provided further*, That the require-
18 ment for a notification through the regular notification
19 procedures of the Committees on Appropriations con-
20 tained in subsection (b)(3) of section 533 shall be deemed
21 to be satisfied if the Committees on Appropriations are
22 notified at least 5 days prior to the obligation of such
23 funds: *Provided further*, That the entire amount is des-
24 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement

1 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget
2 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

3 ASSISTANCE FOR EASTERN EUROPE AND THE BALTIC
4 STATES

5 For an additional amount for “Assistance for East-
6 ern Europe and the Baltic States”, \$75,000,000, to re-
7 main available until September 30, 2000, of which up to
8 \$1,000,000 may be used for administrative costs of the
9 U.S. Agency for International Development: *Provided*,
10 That the entire amount is designated by the Congress as
11 an emergency requirement pursuant to section
12 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
13 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*,
14 That funds appropriated under this heading shall be obli-
15 gated and expended subject to the regular notification pro-
16 cedures of the Committees on Appropriations.

17 DEPARTMENT OF STATE

18 MIGRATION AND REFUGEE ASSISTANCE

19 For an additional amount for “Migration and Ref-
20 ugee Assistance”, \$195,000,000, to remain available until
21 September 30, 2000, of which not more than \$500,000
22 is for administrative expenses: *Provided*, That the entire
23 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
24 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-
25 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
26 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount

1 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget
2 request for a specific dollar amount, that includes designa-
3 tion of the entire amount of the request as an emergency
4 requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emer-

17 GENERAL PROVISION—THIS CHAPTER

23 GENERAL PROVISION—THIS CHAPTER

24 SEC. 401. In addition to amounts appropriated or

3 until September 30, 2003, as follows:

15 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget
16 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended:
17 *Provided further*, That the entire amount shall be available
18 only to the extent that an official budget request for
19 \$831,000,000, that includes designation of the entire
20 amount of the request as an emergency requirement as
21 defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
22 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the
23 President to the Congress.

CHAPTER 5

GENERAL PROVISION

2

3 SEC. 501. No part of any appropriation contained in
4 the Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
5 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

6 SEC. 502. It is the sense of the Congress that there
7 should continue to be parity between the adjustments in
8 the compensation of members of the uniformed services
9 and the adjustments in the compensation of civilian em-
10 ployees of the United States.

11 This Act may be cited as the “Kosovo and Southwest
12 Asia Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1999”.
