A BILL

To provide for a reduction in regulatory costs by maintaining Federal average fuel economy standards applicable to automobiles in effect at current levels until changed by law.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AVERAGE FUEL ECONOMY STANDARDS.**

4 The average fuel economy standards established,
5 whether directly or indirectly, under regulations promul-
6 gated by the Secretary of Transportation under section

1 32901 et seq. of title 49, United States Code, prior to
2 the date of the enactment of this Act for automobiles (as
3 defined in section 32901 of such title) shall continue to
4 apply without amendment, change, or other modification
5 of any kind for the model years and the applicable auto-
6 mobiles specified in the regulation last promulgated for
7 such automobiles and for each model year thereafter until
8 such regulations are specifically amended or otherwise
9 changed by law enacted after the date of the enactment
10 of this Act.
