A BILL

To provide for the posthumous promotion of William Clark of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Commonwealth of Kentucky, co-leader of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, to the grade of captain in the Regular Army.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. POSTHUMOUS PROMOTION OF WILLIAM**
2 **CLARK, CO-LEADER OF THE LEWIS AND**
3 **CLARK EXPEDITION, TO THE GRADE OF CAP-**
4 **TAIN IN THE REGULAR ARMY.**

5 (a) **POSTHUMOUS PROMOTION.**—William Clark, of
6 the Commonwealth of Virginia and the Commonwealth of
7 Kentucky, co-leader of the Lewis and Clark Expedition of
8 1804–1806, shall be deemed for all purposes to have held
9 the grade of captain, rather than lieutenant, in the Reg-
10 ular Army, effective as of March 26, 1804, and continuing
11 until his separation from the Army on February 27, 1807.

12 (b) **PROHIBITION OF BENEFITS.**—No person is enti-
13 tled to any bonus, gratuity, pay, or allowance because of
14 the provisions of subsection (a).
