## A BILL

For the relief of certain Persian Gulf evacuees.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS FOR CERTAIN PER-**  
4 **SIAN GULF EVACUEES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall adjust  
6 the status of each alien referred to in subsection (b) to  
7 that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence  
8 if the alien—

1 (1) applies for such adjustment;

2 (2) has been physically present in the United  
3 States for at least 1 year and is physically present  
4 in the United States on the date the application for  
5 such adjustment is filed;

6 (3) is admissible to the United States as an im-  
7 migrant, except as provided in subsection (c); and

8 (4) pays a fee (determined by the Attorney  
9 General) for the processing of such application.

10 (b) ALIENS ELIGIBLE FOR ADJUSTMENT OF STA-  
11 TUS.—The benefits provided in subsection (a) shall apply  
12 to the following aliens:

14 (c) WAIVER OF CERTAIN GROUNDS FOR INADMIS-  
15 SIBILITY.—The provisions of paragraphs (4), (5), and  
16 (7)(A) of section 212(a) of the Immigration and Nation-  
17 ality Act shall not apply to adjustment of status under  
18 this Act.

19 (d) OFFSET IN NUMBER OF VISAS AVAILABLE.—  
20 Upon each granting to an alien of the status of having  
21 been lawfully admitted for permanent residence under this  
22 section, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper  
23 officer to reduce by 1, during the current or next following  
24 fiscal year, the total number of immigrant visas that are  
25 made available to natives of the country of the alien's birth

1 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Nationality  
2 Act or, if applicable, the total number of immigrant visas  
3 that are made available to natives of the country of the  
4 alien's birth under section 202(e) of such Act.

5 (e) DENIAL OF PREFERENTIAL IMMIGRATION  
6 TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN RELATIVES.—The natural  
7 parents, brothers, and sisters of an individual referred to  
8 in subsection (b) shall not, by virtue of such relationship,  
9 be accorded any right, privilege, or status under the Immi-  
10 gration and Nationality Act.
