Mr. EDWARDS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit certain abortions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Banning Late Term
5 Abortions Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN ABORTIONS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—It shall be unlawful, in or affect-
8 ing interstate or foreign commerce, knowingly to perform
9 an abortion after the fetus has become viable.

1 (b) EXCEPTION.—This section does not prohibit any
2 abortion if, at the time of the abortion the physician con-
3 cludes in good faith according to the physician’s best med-
4 ical judgment, the abortion is necessary to preserve the
5 life of the woman or to avert serious adverse health con-
6 sequences to the woman.

7 (c) CIVIL PENALTY.—A physician who violates this
8 section shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed
9 \$100,000.
