## A BILL

To redesignate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 1602 Frankford Avenue in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, as the “Joseph F. Smith Post Office Building”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REDESIGNATION.**

4 The facility of the United States Postal Service lo-  
5 cated at 1602 Frankford Avenue in Philadelphia, Pennsylv-  
6 ania, and known as the Kensington Station, shall be

1 known and designated as the “Joseph F. Smith Post Of-  
2 fice Building”.

3 **SEC. 2. REFERENCES.**

4 Any reference in a law, map, regulation, document,  
5 paper, or other record of the United States to the facility  
6 referred to in section 1 shall be deemed to be a reference  
7 to the “Joseph F. Smith Post Office Building”.
