3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TIME PERIOD FOR FILING CER-**
4 **TAIN COMPLAINTS UNDER PERISHABLE AG-**
5 **RICULTURAL COMMODITIES ACT, 1930.**

6 Section 6(a)(1) of the Perishable Agricultural Com-
7 modities Act, 1930 (7 U.S.C. 499f(a)(1)) is amended by

1 adding at the end the following: “Notwithstanding the pre-
2 ceding sentence, a person that desires to file a complaint
3 under this section involving the allegation of false inspec-
4 tion certificates prepared by graders of the Department
5 of Agriculture at Hunts Point Terminal Market, Bronx,
6 New York, prior to October 27, 1999, may file the com-
7 plaint until January 1, 2001.”.
