AN ACT

To clarify the intention of the Congress with regard to the authority of the United States Mint to produce numismatic coins, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “United States Mint
3 Numismatic Coin Clarification Act of 2000”.

4 **SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF MINT’S AUTHORITY.**

5 (a) SILVER PROOF COINS.—Section 5132(a)(2)(B)(i)
6 of title 31, United States Code, is amended by striking
7 “paragraphs (1)” and inserting “paragraphs (2)”.

8 (b) PLATINUM COINS.—Section 5112(k) of title 31,
9 United States Code, is amended by striking “bullion” and
10 inserting “platinum bullion coins”.

11 **SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL REPORT REQUIREMENT.**

12 Section 5134(e)(2) of title 31, United States Code,
13 is amended—

14 (1) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A),
15 by striking “reflect” and inserting “contain”;

16 (2) by striking “and” at the end of subpara-
17 graph (C);

18 (3) by striking the period at the end of sub-
19 paragraph (D) and inserting “; and”; and

20 (4) by adding at the end the following new sub-
21 paragraph:

22 “(E) a supplemental schedule detailing—

23 “(i) the costs and expenses for the
24 production, for the marketing, and for the
25 distribution of each denomination of circu-
26 lating coins produced by the Mint during

1 the fiscal year and the per-unit cost of pro-
2 ducing, of marketing, and of distributing
3 each denomination of such coins; and
4 “(ii) the gross revenue derived from
5 the sales of each such denomination of
6 coins.”.
