## A BILL

To provide that an amount available for fiscal year 2001 for the Department of Transportation shall be available to reimburse certain costs incurred for clean-up of former Coast Guard facilities at Cape May, New Jersey, and to authorize the Coast Guard to transfer funds and authority for demolition and removal of a structure at former Coast Guard property in Traverse City, Michigan.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. COSTS OF CLEAN-UP OF CAPE MAY LIGHT-**  
2 **HOUSE.**

3 Of the funds made available in the Department of  
4 Transportation and Related Agencies Appropriations Act,  
5 2001 for environmental compliance and restoration of  
6 Coast Guard facilities, \$100,000 shall be available to reim-  
7 burse the owner of the former Coast Guard lighthouse fa-  
8 cility at Cape May, New Jersey, for costs incurred for  
9 clean-up of lead contaminated soil at that facility.

10 **SEC. 2. DEMOLITION AND REMOVAL OF BUILDING AT**  
11 **FORMER COAST GUARD PROPERTY IN TRA-**  
12 **VERSE CITY, MICHIGAN.**

13 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and sub-  
14 ject to the availability of funds appropriated specifically  
15 for the project, the Coast Guard is authorized to transfer  
16 funds in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 and project  
17 management authority to the Traverse City Area Public  
18 School District for the purposes of demolition and removal  
19 of the structure commonly known as “Building 402” at  
20 former Coast Guard property located in Traverse City,  
21 Michigan, and associated site work. No such funds shall  
22 be transferred until the Coast Guard receives a detailed,  
23 fixed price estimate from the School District describing  
24 the nature and cost of the work to be performed, and the  
25 Coast Guard shall transfer only that amount of funds it

1 and the School District consider necessary to complete the  
2 project.
