## A BILL

To amend the Act that established the Keweenaw National Historical Park to require the Secretary of the Interior to consider nominees of various local interests in appointing members of the Keweenaw National Historical Parks Advisory Commission.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS TO KEWEENAW NATIONAL HIS-**  
4       **TORICAL PARKS ADVISORY COMMISSION.**

5       (a) CONSIDERATION OF STATE AND LOCAL NOMI-  
6       NEES.—Section 9(c)(1) of the Act entitled “An Act to es-  
7       tablish the Keweenaw National Historical Park, and for

1 other purposes” (Public Law 102–543; 16 U.S.C. 410yy–  
2 8(c)(1)) is amended by striking “from nominees” each  
3 place it appears and inserting “after consideration of  
4 nominees”.

5 (b) EXPLANATION OF FAILURE TO APPOINT STATE  
6 OR LOCAL NOMINEE.—Section 9(c)(1) of such Act (16  
7 U.S.C. 410yy–8(c)(1)) is further amended by adding at  
8 the end the following:

9 “If the Secretary determines to appoint a member  
10 under subparagraph (A), (B), (C), or (D) who is not  
11 a nominee referred to in that subparagraph, the Sec-  
12 retary shall submit a written explanation for the de-  
13 termination to the Congress by not later than 30  
14 days before the effective date of the appointment.”.
