Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 800) to provide for education flexibility partnerships.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 800) to provide for education flexi-
6 bility partnerships. The first reading of the bill shall be
7 dispensed with. Points of order against consideration of
8 the bill for failure to comply with clause 4(a) of rule XIII

1 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
2 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
3 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
4 the Committee on Education and the Workforce. After
5 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
6 under the five-minute rule for a period not to exceed 5
7 hours. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill
8 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule
9 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended
10 by the Committee on Education and the Workforce now
11 printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the na-
12 ture of a substitute shall be considered as read. No amend-
13 ment to the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
14 stitute shall be in order except those printed in the portion
15 of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose
16 in clause 8 of rule XVIII and except pro forma amend-
17 ments for the purpose of debate. Each amendment printed
18 in the Record may be offered only by the Member who
19 caused it to be printed or his designee and shall be consid-
20 ered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole
21 may:

22 (1) postpone until a time during further consid-
23 eration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
24 a recorded vote on any amendment; and

1 (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum time
2 for electronic voting on any postponed question that
3 follows another electronic vote without intervening
4 business, provided that the minimum time for elec-
5 tronic voting on the first in any series of questions
6 shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-
7 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall
8 rise and report the bill to the House with such
9 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Mem-
10 ber may demand a separate vote in the House on
11 any amendment adopted in the Committee of the
12 Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in
13 the nature of a substitute. The previous question
14 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
15 amendments thereto to final passage without inter-
16 vening motion except one motion to recommit with
17 or without instructions.
