## RESOLUTION

Providing amounts for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Sixth Congress.

1      *Resolved,*

1 **SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-**  
2 **DRED SIXTH CONGRESS.**

3 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—With respect to the One Hundred  
4 Sixth Congress, there shall be paid out of the applicable  
5 accounts of the House of Representatives, in accordance  
6 with this primary expense resolution, not more than the  
7 amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses (includ-  
8 ing the expenses of all staff salaries) of each committee  
9 named in that subsection.

10 (b) *COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.*—The committees and  
11 amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee on Ag-

3 **SEC. 2. FIRST SESSION LIMITATIONS.**

7 *able for expenses incurred during the period beginning at*  
8 *noon on January 3, 1999, and ending immediately before*  
9 *noon on January 3, 2000.*

7 *able for expenses incurred during the period beginning at*  
8 *noon on January 3, 2000, and ending immediately before*  
9 *noon on January 3, 2001.*

3 **SEC. 4. VOUCHERS.**

4 *Payments under this resolution shall be made on*  
5 *vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed by*  
6 *the chairman of such committee, and approved in the man-*  
7 *ner directed by the Committee on House Administration.*

8 **SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.**

9 *Amounts made available under this resolution shall be*  
10 *expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by the*  
11 *Committee on House Administration.*

12 **SEC. 6. RESERVE FUND FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENSES.**

13 *There is hereby established a reserve fund of \$3,000,000*  
14 *for unanticipated expenses of committees for the One Hun-*  
15 *dred Sixth Congress. Amounts in the fund shall be paid*  
16 *to a committee pursuant to an allocation approved by the*  
17 *Committee on House Administration.*

18 **SEC. 7. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.**

19 *The Committee on House Administration shall have*  
20 *authority to make adjustments in amounts under section*  
21 *1, if necessary to comply with an order of the President*  
22 *issued under section 254 of the Balanced Budget and Emer-*  
23 *gency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform to any re-*  
24 *duction in appropriations for the purposes of such section*  
25 *1.*
