Mr. HASTINGS of Washington, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 659) to authorize appropriations for the protection of Paoli and Brandywine Battlefields in Pennsylvania, to direct the National Park Service to conduct a special resource study of Paoli and Brandywine Battlefields, to authorize the Valley Forge Museum of the American Revolution at Valley Forge National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 659) to authorize appropriations
6 for the protection of Paoli and Brandywine Battlefields
7 in Pennsylvania, to direct the National Park Service to
8 conduct a special resource study of Paoli and Brandywine
9 Battlefields, to authorize the Valley Forge Museum of the
10 American Revolution at Valley Forge National Historical
11 Park, and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill
12 shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined
13 to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided
14 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
15 member of the Committee on Resources. After general de-
16 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the
17 five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an
18 original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-
19 minute rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute
20 recommended by the Committee on Resources now printed
21 in the bill. The committee amendment in the nature of
22 a substitute shall be considered by title rather than by
23 section. Each title shall be considered as read. During con-
24 sideration of the bill for amendment, the chairman of the
25 Committee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition

1 on the basis of whether the Member offering an amend-
2 ment has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Con-
3 gressional Record designated for that purpose in clause
4 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be consid-
5 ered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole
6 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-
7 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-
8 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five
9 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any
10 postponed question that follows another electronic vote
11 without intervening business, provided that the minimum
12 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-
13 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-
14 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
15 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
16 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
17 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
18 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the com-
19 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The pre-
20 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
21 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-
22 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or
23 without instructions.
