Mr. REYNOLDS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2084) making appropriations for the Department of Transportation and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the house resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2084) making appropriations for
6 the Department of Transportation and related agencies

1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for
2 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
3 pensed with. Points of order against consideration of the
4 bill for failure to comply with clause 4(c) of rule XIII or
5 section 401(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
6 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
7 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
8 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
9 the Committee on Appropriations. After general debate
10 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
11 minute rule. Points of order against provisions in the bill
12 for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived
13 except as follows: page 10, line 16, through page 13, line
14 13; “Notwithstanding any other provision of law,” on page
15 13, line 16; “Notwithstanding any other provision of law,”
16 on page 15, line 20; “Notwithstanding any other provision
17 of law,” on page 17, line 14; “Notwithstanding any other
18 provision of law,” on page 18, line 4; “Notwithstanding
19 any other provision of law,” on page 19, line 5; “Notwith-
20 standing any other provision of law,” on page 19, line 25;
21 “Notwithstanding any other provision of law,” on page 25,
22 line 9; “Notwithstanding any other provision of law,” on
23 page 32, line 8; page 50, lines 1 through 9; page 50, line
24 22, through page 51, line 12; and page 52, lines 1 through
25 10. Where points of order are waived against part of a

1 paragraph, points of order against a provision in another
2 part of such paragraph may be made only against such
3 provision and not against the entire paragraph. The
4 amendment printed in the report of the Committee on
5 Rules accompanying this resolution may be offered only
6 by a Member designated in the report and only at the ap-
7 propriate point in the reading of the bill, shall be consid-
8 ered as read, and shall not be subject to amendment.
9 Points of order against the amendment printed in the re-
10 port for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are
11 waived. During consideration of the bill for further amend-
12 ment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may
13 accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the
14 Member offering an amendment has caused it to be print-
15 ed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated
16 for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments
17 so printed shall be considered as read. The chairman of
18 the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a
19 time during further consideration in the Committee of the
20 Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amendment;
21 and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum time for elec-
22 tronic voting on any postponed question that follows an-
23 other electronic vote without intervening business, pro-
24 vided that the minimum time for electronic voting on the
25 first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes. At

1 the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment
2 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House
3 with such amendments as may have been adopted. The
4 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
5 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
6 tervening motion except one motion to recommit with or
7 without instructions.

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
