Mr. HASTINGS of Washington, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 66) to preserve the cultural resources of the Route 66 corridor and to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide assistance.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 66) to preserve the cultural re-

1 sources of the Route 66 corridor and to authorize the Sec-  
2 retary of the Interior to provide assistance. The first read-  
3 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall  
4 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
5 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
6 nority member of the Committee on Resources. After gen-  
7 eral debate the bill shall be considered for amendment  
8 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider  
9 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under  
10 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-  
11 stitute recommended by the Committee on Resources now  
12 printed in the bill. Each section of the committee amend-  
13 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as  
14 read. During consideration of the bill for amendment, the  
15 Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord pri-  
16 ority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member  
17 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the  
18 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that  
19 purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed  
20 shall be considered as read. The Chairman of the Com-  
21 mittee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during  
22 further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a re-  
23 quest for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) re-  
24 duce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic vot-  
25 ing on any postponed question that follows another elec-

1 tronic vote without intervening business, provided that the  
2 minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any se-  
3 ries of questions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion  
4 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee  
5 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such  
6 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may  
7 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment  
8 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to  
9 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.  
10 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
11 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
12 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with  
13 or without instructions.
