Mr. LINDER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2587) making appropriations for the government of the District of Columbia and other activities chargeable in whole or in part against revenues of said District for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2587) making appropriations for

1 the government of the District of Columbia and other ac-
2 tivities chargeable in whole or in part against revenues of
3 said District for the fiscal year ending September 30,
4 2000, and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill
5 shall be dispensed with. Points of order against consider-
6 ation of the bill for failure to comply with clause 4(c) of
7 rule XIII or section 306 or section 401 of the Congres-
8 sional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General debate
9 shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour
10 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
11 ing minority member of the Committee on Appropriations.
12 After general debate the bill shall be considered for
13 amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order
14 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with
15 clause 2 of rule XXI are waived. The amendments printed
16 in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
17 this resolution may be offered only by a Member des-
18 ignated in the report and only at the appropriate point
19 in the reading of the bill, shall be considered as read, shall
20 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
21 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
22 and shall not be subject to amendment. All points of order
23 against the amendments printed in the report are waived.
24 During consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chair-
25 man of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority

1 in recognition on the basis of whether the Member offering
2 an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion
3 of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose
4 in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall
5 be considered as read. The Chairman of the Committee
6 of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further
7 consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for
8 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five
9 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any
10 postponed question that follows another electronic vote
11 without intervening business, provided that the minimum
12 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-
13 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-
14 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
15 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
16 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall
17 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
18 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except
19 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
