Mr. LINDER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2670) making appropriations for the Departments of Commerce, Justice, and State, the Judiciary, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2670) making appropriations for

1 the Departments of Commerce, Justice, and State, the Ju-  
2 diciary, and related agencies for the fiscal year ending  
3 September 30, 2000, and for other purposes. The first  
4 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order  
5 against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with  
6 clause 4 of rule XIII and section 306 of the Congressional  
7 Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General debate shall be  
8 confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally  
9 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
10 nority member of the Committee on Appropriations. After  
11 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment  
12 under the five-minute rule. Points of order against provi-  
13 sions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule  
14 XXI are waived. The amendments printed in the report  
15 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution  
16 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report  
17 and only at the appropriate point in the reading of the  
18 bill, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the  
19 time specified in the report equally divided and controlled  
20 by the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be sub-  
21 ject to amendment. All points of order against the amend-  
22 ments printed in the report are waived. During consider-  
23 ation of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Com-  
24 mittee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on  
25 the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment

1 has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congres-  
2 sional Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of  
3 rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered  
4 as read. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
5 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-  
6 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-  
7 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
8 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
9 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
10 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
11 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
12 tions shall be 15 minutes. During consideration of the bill,  
13 points of order against amendments for failure to comply  
14 with clause 2(e) of rule XXI are waived. At the conclusion  
15 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee  
16 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such  
17 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous  
18 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and  
19 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening  
20 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-  
21 structions.
