Mr. DREIER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 99) to amend title 49, United States Code, to extend Federal Aviation Administration programs through September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 99) to amend title 49, United States  
6 Code, to extend Federal Aviation Administration pro-

1 grams through September 30, 1999, and for other pur-  
2 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.  
3 Points of order against consideration of the bill for failure  
4 to comply with clause 4(a) of rule XIII or section 302(f)  
5 or section 303(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974  
6 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill  
7 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-  
8 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of  
9 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.  
10 After general debate, the bill shall be considered for  
11 amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the  
12 amendment recommended by the Committee on Transpor-  
13 tation and Infrastructure now printed in the bill, it shall  
14 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose  
15 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment  
16 in the nature of a substitute printed in the Congressional  
17 Record and numbered 1 pursuant to clause 8 of rule  
18 XVIII. Each section of that amendment in the nature of  
19 a substitute shall be considered as read. Points of order  
20 against the amendment for failure to comply with clause  
21 7 of rule XVI or section 302(f) or section 303(a) of the  
22 Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. During  
23 consideration of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of  
24 the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-  
25 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an

1 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of  
2 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in  
3 clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be  
4 considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the  
5 Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further con-  
6 sideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for  
7 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
8 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
9 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
10 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
11 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
12 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
13 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
14 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
15 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a  
16 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted  
17 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the amend-  
18 ment in the nature of a substitute made in order as origi-  
19 nal text. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
20 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage  
21 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit  
22 with or without instructions.
