Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 764) to reduce the incidence of child abuse and neglect, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 764) to reduce the incidence of child
6 abuse and neglect, and for other purposes. The first read-
7 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order

1 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-
2 bate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one
3 hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
4 ranking minority member of the Committee on the Judici-
5 ary. After general debate the bill shall be considered for
6 amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill shall be
7 considered as read. Points of order against provisions in
8 the bill for failure to comply with clause 4 of rule XXI
9 are waived. During consideration of the bill for amend-
10 ment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may
11 accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the
12 Member offering an amendment has caused it to be print-
13 ed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated
14 for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments
15 so printed shall be considered as read. The Chairman of
16 the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a
17 time during further consideration in the Committee of the
18 Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amendment;
19 and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum time for elec-
20 tronic voting on any postponed question that follows an-
21 other electronic vote without intervening business, pro-
22 vided that the minimum time for electronic voting on the
23 first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes. At
24 the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment
25 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House

1 with such amendments as may have been adopted. The
2 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
3 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
4 tervening motion except one motion to recommit with or
5 without instructions.
