Mr. DIAZ-BALART, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3822) to reduce, suspend, or terminate any assistance under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 and the Arms Export Control Act to each country determined by the President to be engaged in oil price fixing to the detriment of the United States economy, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 3822) to reduce, suspend, or termi-
3 nate any assistance under the Foreign Assistance Act of
4 1961 and the Arms Export Control Act to each country
5 determined by the President to be engaged in oil price fix-
6 ing to the detriment of the United States economy, and
7 for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be
8 dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the
9 bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
10 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
11 the Committee on International Relations. After general
12 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under
13 the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as
14 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the
15 five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
16 stitute recommended by the Committee on International
17 Relations now printed in the bill, modified by striking sub-
18 section 6(c). Each section of that amendment in the na-
19 ture of a substitute shall be considered as read. No amend-
20 ment to that amendment in the nature of a substitute
21 shall be in order except those printed in the portion of
22 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in
23 clause 8 of rule XVIII and except pro forma amendments
24 for the purpose of debate. Each amendment so printed
25 may be offered only by the Member who caused it to be

1 printed or his designee and shall be considered as read.
2 The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may: (1)
3 Postpone until a time during further consideration in the
4 Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on
5 any amendment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the min-
6 imum time for electronic voting on any postponed question
7 that follows another electronic vote without intervening
8 business, provided that the minimum time for electronic
9 voting on the first in any series of questions shall be 15
10 minutes. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
11 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
12 to the House with such amendments as may have been
13 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the
14 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of
15 the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature
16 of a substitute made in order as original text. The previous
17 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
18 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
19 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
20 structions.
