Mr. REYNOLDS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4425) making appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4425) making appropriations for

1 military construction, family housing, and base realign-
2 ment and closure for the Department of Defense for the
3 fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, and for other pur-
4 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
5 Points of order against consideration of the bill for failure
6 to comply with clause 4(c) of rule XIII are waived. General
7 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
8 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman
9 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-
10 priations. After general debate the bill shall be considered
11 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order
12 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with
13 clause 2 of rule XXI are waived. During consideration of
14 the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee
15 of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the
16 basis of whether the Member offering an amendment has
17 caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional
18 Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule
19 XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as
20 read. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may:
21 (1) postpone until a time during further consideration in
22 the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote
23 on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the
24 minimum time for electronic voting on any postponed
25 question that follows another electronic vote without inter-

1 vening business, provided that the minimum time for elec-
2 tronic voting on the first in any series of questions shall
3 be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consideration of the
4 bill for amendments the Committee shall rise and report
5 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have
6 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered
7 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
8 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
9 recommit with or without instructions.

10 SEC. 2. For purposes of enforcement of the Congres-
11 sional Budget Act of 1974 in the House, the appropriate
12 levels of total new budget authority and total budget out-
13 lays for fiscal years 2000 through 2005 prescribed by
14 House Concurrent Resolution 290 pursuant to section
15 301(a)(1) of the Act shall be those reflected in the table
16 entitled “Conference Report Fiscal Year 2001 Budget
17 Resolution Total Spending and Revenues” on page 49 of
18 House Report 106–577.

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
