Ms. PRYCE of Ohio, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4635) making appropriations for the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and Urban Development, and for sundry independent agencies, boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 4635) making appropriations for  
3 the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and  
4 Urban Development, and for sundry independent agencies,  
5 boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fis-  
6 cal year ending September 30, 2001, and for other pur-  
7 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.  
8 All points of order against consideration of the bill are  
9 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and  
10 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled  
11 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the  
12 Committee on Appropriations. After general debate the  
13 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
14 minute rule. Points of order against provisions in the bill  
15 for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived  
16 except as follows: beginning with “except that” on page  
17 63, line 4, through “drinking water contaminants” on line  
18 8; page 67, lines 4 through 14. Where points of order are  
19 waived against part of a paragraph, points of order  
20 against a provision in another part of such paragraph may  
21 be made only against such provision and not against the  
22 entire paragraph. During consideration of the bill for  
23 amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
24 may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether  
25 the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be

1 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-  
2 ignated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amend-  
3 ments so printed shall be considered as read. The Chair-  
4 man of the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone  
5 until a time during further consideration in the Committee  
6 of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amend-  
7 ment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum time  
8 for electronic voting on any postponed question that fol-  
9 lows another electronic vote without intervening business,  
10 provided that the minimum time for electronic voting on  
11 the first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes.  
12 During consideration of the bill, points of order against  
13 amendments for failure to comply with clause 2(e) of rule  
14 XXI are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the  
15 bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report  
16 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have  
17 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered  
18 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final  
19 passage without intervening motion except one motion to  
20 recommit with or without instructions.

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
