Mr. LINDER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 438) to promote and enhance public safety through use of 911 as the universal emergency assistance number, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 438) to promote and enhance public
6 safety through use of 911 as the universal emergency as-

1 sistance number, and for other purposes. The first reading
2 of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order against
3 consideration of the bill for failure to comply with clause
4 4(a) of rule XIII are waived. General debate shall be con-
5 fined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally di-
6 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
7 ity member of the Committee on Commerce. After general
8 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under
9 the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as
10 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the
11 five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
12 stitute recommended by the Committee on Commerce now
13 printed in the bill. Each section of the committee amend-
14 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as
15 read. During consideration of the bill for amendment, the
16 chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord pri-
17 ority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member
18 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the
19 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that
20 purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed
21 shall be considered as read. The chairman of the Commit-
22 tee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during
23 further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a re-
24 quest for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) re-
25 duce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic vot-

1 ing on any postponed question that follows another elec-
2 tronic vote without intervening business, provided that the
3 minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any se-
4 ries of questions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion
5 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
6 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
7 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
8 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
9 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
10 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
11 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
12 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
13 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
14 or without instructions.
