To direct the Secretary of the Interior to issue to the Landusky School District, without consideration, a patent for the surface and mineral estates of certain lots, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LANDUSKY SCHOOL LOTS TRANSFER.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to valid rights in exist-
5 ence on the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
6 of the Interior shall issue to the Landusky School District,
7 without consideration, a patent for the surface and min-
8 eral estates of certain lots consisting of approximately

1 2.06 acres and described by the coordinates T.25 N, R
2 24 E, PM Montana, sec. 27 block 2, school reserve, sec.
3 27, block 3, lot 13.

4 (b) ADMINISTRATION.—In carrying out this section,
5 the Secretary shall not be required to comply with—

6 (1) National Environmental Policy Act of 1969
7 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.);

8 (2) the Historic Preservation Act of the State
9 of Montana; and

10 (3) any Executive Order pertaining to flood
11 plains or wetlands.

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
