## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit certain interstate conduct relating to exotic animals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Captive Exotic Animal  
5 Protection Act of 1999”.

1 **SEC. 2. TRANSPORT OR POSSESSION OF EXOTIC ANIMALS**  
2 **FOR PURPOSES OF KILLING OR INJURING**  
3 **THEM.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 3 of title 18, United  
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
6 lowing:

7 **“§ 48. Exotic animals**

8 “(a) PROHIBITION.—Whoever, in or affecting inter-  
9 state or foreign commerce, knowingly transfers, trans-  
10 ports, or possesses a confined exotic animal, for the pur-  
11 poses of allowing the killing or injuring of that animal for  
12 entertainment or for the collection of a trophy, shall be  
13 fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 1 year,  
14 or both.

15 “(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

16 “(1) the term ‘confined exotic animal’ means a  
17 mammal of a species not historically indigenous to  
18 the United States, that has been held in captivity for  
19 the shorter of—

20 “(A) the greater part of the life of the ani-  
21 mal; or

22 “(B) a period of 1 year;

23 whether or not the defendant knew the length of the  
24 captivity; and

25 “(2) the term ‘captivity’ does not include any  
26 period during which an animal—

1           “(A) lives as it would in the wild, surviving  
2           primarily by foraging for naturally occurring  
3           food, roaming at will over an open area of not  
4           less than 1,000 acres; and

5           “(B) has the opportunity to avoid hunt-  
6           ers.”.

7           (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The analysis for chap-  
8           ter 3 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by add-  
9           ing at the end the following:

“48. Exotic animals.”.
