A BILL

To clarify certain boundaries on maps relating to the Coastal Barrier Resources System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPLACEMENT OF COASTAL BARRIER RE-**
4 **SOURCES SYSTEM MAPS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The 7 maps described in sub-
6 section (b) are replaced by 31 maps entitled “Coastal Bar-
7 rier Resources System, NC–03P”, designated as Cape
8 Hatteras 5A through 5G, and dated May 26, 1999.

9 (b) MAPS DESCRIBED.—The maps described in this
10 subsection are the 7 maps that—

1 (1) relate to the unit of the Coastal Barrier Re-
2 sources System entitled “Cape Hatteras NC-03P”;

3 (2) are designated as Cape Hatteras 5A
4 through 5G; and

5 (3) are included in a set of maps entitled
6 “Coastal Barrier Resources System”, dated October
7 24, 1990, and referred to in section 4(a) of the
8 Coastal Barrier Resources Act (16 U.S.C. 3503(a)).

9 (c) AVAILABILITY.—The Secretary of the Interior
10 shall keep the maps that replace the maps described in
11 subsection (b) on file and available for inspection in ac-
12 cordance with section 4(b) of the Coastal Barrier Re-
13 sources Act (16 U.S.C. 3503(b)).

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
