Mr. MCCAIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 36, United States Code, to designate May as “National Military Appreciation Month”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIONAL MILITARY APPRECIATION MONTH.**

4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
5 ings:

6 (1) The freedom and security that citizens of
7 the United States enjoy today are direct results of
8 the vigilance of the United States Armed Forces.

9 (2) Recognizing contributions made by mem-
10 bers of the United States Armed Forces will increase

1 national awareness of the sacrifices that such mem-
2 bers have made to preserve the freedoms and lib-
3 erties that enrich this Nation.

4 (3) It is important to preserve and foster admi-
5 ration and respect for the service provided by mem-
6 bers of the United States Armed Forces.

7 (4) It is vital for youth in the United States to
8 understand that the service provided by members of
9 the United States Armed Forces has secured and
10 protected the freedoms that United States citizens
11 enjoy today.

12 (5) Recognizing the unfailing support that fam-
13 ilies of members of the United States Armed Forces
14 have provided to such members during their service
15 and how such support strengthens the vitality of our
16 Nation is important.

17 (6) Recognizing the role that the United States
18 Armed Forces plays in maintaining the superiority
19 of the United States as a nation and in contributing
20 to world peace will increase awareness of all con-
21 tributions made by such Forces.

22 (7) It is appropriate to recognize the impor-
23 tance of maintaining a strong, equipped, well-edu-
24 cated, well-trained military for the United States to

1 safeguard freedoms, humanitarianism, and peace-
2 keeping efforts around the world.

3 (8) It is proper to foster and cultivate the
4 honor and pride that citizens of the United States
5 feel towards members of the United States Armed
6 Forces for the protection and service that such
7 members provide.

8 (9) Recognizing the many sacrifices made by
9 members of the United States Armed Forces is im-
10 portant.

11 (10) It is proper to recognize and honor the
12 dedication and commitment of members of the
13 United States Armed Forces, and to show apprecia-
14 tion for all contributions made by such members
15 since the inception of such Forces.

16 (b) NATIONAL MILITARY APPRECIATION MONTH.—
17 Chapter 1 of part A of subtitle I of title 36, United States
18 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

19 **“§ 144. National Military Appreciation Month**

20 “The President shall issue each year a
21 proclamation—

22 “(1) designating May as ‘National Military Ap-
23 preciation Month’; and

24 “(2) calling on the people of the United States
25 to honor the dedicated service provided by the mem-

1 bers of the United States Armed Forces and to ob-
2 serve the month with appropriate ceremonies and ac-
3 tivities.”.

4 (c) TABLE OF CONTENTS.—The table of contents in
5 chapter 1 of part A of subtitle I of title 36, United States
6 Code, is amended by inserting after the item relating to
7 section 143 the following new item:

“144. National Military Appreciation Month.”.
