Mr. WYDEN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To exempt certain entries of titanium disks from anti-dumping duties retroactively applied by the United States Customs Service.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TREATMENT OF CERTAIN ENTRIES OF TITA-**
4 **NIUM DISKS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
6 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 15144) or any other
7 provision of law, the United States Customs Service
8 shall—

9 (1) not later than 90 days after the date of the
10 enactment of this Act, liquidate or reliquidate the

1 entries listed in subsection (b) as exempt from anti-
 2 dumping duties under antidumping case number A-
 3 462-103; and

4 (2) not later than 90 days after such liquida-
 5 tion or reliquidation under paragraph (1), refund
 6 any antidumping duties paid with respect to such
 7 entries, including interest from the date of entry, if
 8 the importer of the entries files a request therefor
 9 with the Customs Service within such 90-day period.

10 (b) ENTRIES.—The entries referred to in subsection
 11 (a) are as follows:
