Mr. GRASSLEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To strengthen and enhance the role of community antidrug coalitions by providing for the establishment of a National Community Antidrug Coalition Institute.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Community
5 Antidrug Coalition Institute Act of 2000”.

6 **SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the Office of Na-
8 tional Drug Control Policy may make grants to an organi-

1 zation to provide for the establishment of a National Com-
2 munity Antidrug Coalition Institute.

3 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—The organization receiving a
4 grant under subsection (a) shall—

5 (1) be a national nonprofit organization that
6 represents, provides technical assistance and train-
7 ing to, and has special expertise and broad, national-
8 level experience in community anti-drug coalitions;
9 and

10 (2) establish a National Community Antidrug
11 Coalition Institute that will—

12 (A) provide education, training, and tech-
13 nical assistance for coalition leaders and com-
14 munity teams;

15 (B) conduct research, testing, and diffu-
16 sion of tools, mechanisms, and measures to bet-
17 ter evaluate and document coalition perform-
18 ance measures and outcomes; and

19 (C) bridge the gap between research and
20 practice by translating knowledge from research
21 into practical information.

22 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION.**

23 There are authorized to be appropriated \$2,000,000
24 for 2 years to make grants as provided in section 2.
